Mexico's efforts to modernize infrastructure and public services have not produced corresponding improvements in the legal system. "Wild west" conditions exist in Mexico's courts of law. Social violence is still very much a part of Mexican politics. A new guerrilla group has emerged in recent weeks, launching attacks on police and military units in several states. The rebels are not considered a threat to the Mexican government, but their attacks are likely to dampen a recent surge in investor enthusiasm about the country's economic recovery.

Since mid-March, however, the government has been retreating on the privatization of Pemex's plants, leaving the electric sector as the targeted credit-worthy sector by default.

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The Salinas Government completed a set of air quality guidelines that would take effect on January 1, 1998, and which, in effect, would require a massive shifting to natural gas within selected urban and industrial areas. To our knowledge, no one has tried to quantify, either as a whole or by region, the absolute volumes of natural gas that would be required to comply with the new air quality standards. Attached is a list of the cities and industrial areas that are identified as Critical Zones in the Air Quality Act (published in the Mexican Federal Register on December 2, 1994, two days after President Zedillo was inaugurated).
